## Celebrating Alberta Find a Provider

Dear Colleagues,

It is an incredible privilege — and a deeply satisfying moment for me personally — to write about the official launch of [Alberta Find a Provider](#), the next chapter in a story that began as a grassroots effort and has now grown into a truly provincial platform.

As many of you know, versions of this service existed in Edmonton and Calgary prior to the launch of the provincial website in 2019 — including the *Calgary and Area Docs* website, created through the collaborative spirit of Calgary's Primary Care Networks (PCNs), and initially hosted by my home PCN in South Calgary. Its provincial value was quickly recognized, and other zones came together to expand, enhance and maintain the site for all Albertans as [AlbertaFindaDoctor.ca](#). I am deeply appreciative for the communicators and operational leaders who nurtured this initiative through its transfer to Primary Care Alberta.

Watching this platform grow — much like witnessing a child develop from infancy into maturity — has been both rewarding and humbling. The site is one of the clearest examples of what we can achieve when we collaborate boldly and stay committed to meeting the needs of our population.

### A new name and expanded vision

As part of the [Government of Alberta's announcement](#), the site has officially transitioned from *Alberta Find a Doctor* and the new URL, [AlbertaFindaProvider.ca](#), is now live. This evolution reinforces our collective commitment to team-based care and appropriate provider matching, helping patients connect with the right provider, at the right time, for their needs.

All current information will redirect seamlessly to the updated site, which now offers:

- Improved navigation and enhanced search capabilities, making it easier for Albertans to find a family doctor, nurse practitioner or clinic accepting new patients.
- A new link to the [Alberta Association of Midwives](#) directory, supporting pregnant patients in accessing registered midwifery care across the province.
- Minimal disruption for current users and providers: Logins, workflows and profile management are unchanged, with existing information transferring to the new site.
- A new support email: [afapinfo@primarycarealberta.ca](mailto:afapinfo@primarycarealberta.ca).

In 2024–25 alone, more than 1.2 million visits were recorded, with the majority coming from Calgary and Edmonton — evidence of just how essential this service has become for Albertans.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to this journey — I am proud to celebrate this milestone with you.
