

# COVID-19 in the Calgary Zone: PCN update #3 – March 26, 2020

Dear colleagues,

In the nine days since COVID-19 was declared a pandemic, we have all faced significant challenges to the way in which we practice, run clinics and treat patients. All specialties and services, including both leadership and administrative staff, have been focused solely on the COVID-19 response. With that focus it can be challenging to effectively convey the amount of work being done – not to mention the successes. Often, we only see the continued frustrations and seeming lack of cohesion when, in fact, this is the 'storming' part of the response that is always necessary in a crisis.

Our focus continues to be on maintaining the vital role and influence primary care has and ensuring we can be partners in the response. It is going to require all of us working together. ## **Protective equipment**

PCNs are working hard to ensure family physicians can reorder personal protective equipment for clinics. Please contact your home PCN for order deadlines and other information. Please screen patients as you book them and as they arrive so that you are using your PPE when necessary. We recommend moving your upper respiratory infection patients and those at risk – including patients in self-isolation – based on current guidelines, to appointments later in the day to minimize exposure to other patients and staff. ### **Updated testing protocols**

AHS updated its testing protocols earlier this week. Albertans returning to the province after March 12 who have mild symptoms will no longer be tested for COVID-19. They will be asked to self-isolate at home and away from others. Testing will be prioritized for the following symptomatic patients:

- Hospitalized with respiratory illness
- Residents of continuing care, similar facilities
- Those who returned between March 8 and March 12
- Health care workers with respiratory symptoms

Those with symptoms who don't meet the criteria should stay home and isolate for a minimum of 10 days from the start of their symptoms, or until symptoms resolve – whichever is longer. The <u>online</u> <u>assessment tool</u> has been updated accordingly. <u>Read the bulletin</u>. Physicians experiencing COVID-19 symptoms can call the physician-only line at 587-284-5302 to arrange swabbing. You MUST isolate until given further direction from Public Health or the Medical Officer of Health. Please also connect with your PCN to inform them of your change of status. We are monitoring the situation closely to help inform plans for maintaining primary care services in the Zone. <u>Testing FAQ for health professionals</u>

### Specialty care access

Given pandemic planning, access to ambulatory specialty care services will be significantly reduced, limited to urgent/emergent requests. Availability is expected to contract further. Please consider holding any non-urgent referrals at this time. Your PCN Zone team is working on the following:

- A care pathway for COVID-positive patients in the community to ensure ongoing access to a specialist team/imaging, as needed
- Increased tele-advice support via Specialist LINK
- Broadening the use of Specialist LINK to include urgent, non-RAAPID concerns
- Additional enhanced primary care pathways
