

More pharmacies set to offer Paxlovid

Effective Friday, April 1, more pharmacies will be able to offer Paxlovid to eligible Albertans.

Due to limited supplies, only 135 pharmacies in Alberta were initially able to order the COVID-19 treatment. Any interested pharmacy can now order the treatment. An updated list of participating pharmacies will be <u>available here</u> in the coming weeks.

While local Primary Care Networks continue to work on developing a strategy for Paxlovid prescribing in the Calgary area, <u>eliqible patients</u> should continue to call the dedicated Health Link line at 1-844-343-0971. Health Link staff will ask screening questions to confirm eligibility and arrange for next steps. Paxlovid must be started within five days of the onset of COVID-19 symptoms.

COVID-19 transmission rising

Two key indicators show COVID-19 transmission is rising in the Calgary area and Alberta-wide.

Alberta Health Minister Jason Copping reported the following on Wednesday:

- The positivity rate for <u>PCR tests</u> increased to 24.5 per cent for the period March 22-28, up from 22 per cent the previous week
- Wastewater rates also increased in the Calgary area in the last two weeks
- About 70 per cent of all positive PCR test samples are now the BA.2 variant
- Hospitalization rates are showing small increases

AHS masking requirements

AHS is asking all staff, physicians, volunteers, designated family or support people and visitors to wear a mask and physically distance at AHS, Alberta Precision Laboratories or Covenant Health facilities. Staff and

physicians are encouraged to meet virtually whenever possible and to stay home if sick and/or experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA) recently released <u>updated guidance</u> on masking, as well as a <u>poster for clinics</u> to display in their waiting rooms. The <u>community clinic guidance document</u> has been updated, and AHS recently republished its <u>PPE table for community providers</u>.

Novavax in Alberta

Alberta is in the process of finalizing allocation and eligibility criteria for the Novavax Nuvaxovid COVID-19 vaccine, which was recently approved by Health Canada. The vaccine is expected to be available in Alberta within weeks.
