

Omicron measures

Alberta unveiled several measures this week related to the Omicron variant, as detailed below:

- **Booster eligibility:** Health-care workers who had their second dose more than six months ago and Albertans aged 50 and over can now book a third dose of an mRNA vaccine. Third doses.
- Rapid testing: Beginning Friday, December 17, at-home rapid antigen test kits will be made available to Albertans at selected pharmacies and Alberta Health Services locations.
- Contact tracing: Contact tracing has been initiated in Alberta for close contacts of confirmed or suspected cases of the Omicron variant. Notifications will also occur for close contacts of COVID-19 cases who have recently travelled outside Canada and the U.S., where it hasn't yet been determined if they are positive for the Omicron variant. Close contacts will be asked to monitor for symptoms. If they develop symptoms, they will need to isolate and undergo testing. More details.
- **Health measures:** Restrictions on some indoor social gatherings, which remain limited to 10 people, have been relaxed. There are no longer limits on the number of households and there is no distinction between vaccination status. More details.
