

Booster shot eligibility expanded

Alberta expanded eligibility for booster doses of COVID-19 vaccine this week, starting with those aged 60 and older.

Lower age groups – eventually including all adults aged 18 and older – will be added to eligibility criteria as supply allows. The first appointments for a booster dose of an mRNA vaccine will be scheduled starting Monday, December 6.

Albertans who were previously eligible for third doses continue to be able to book their appointments. All health-care workers who provide direct patient care and who received a second dose less than eight weeks after their first dose are eligible for a third dose, at a minimum of a six-month interval from the second dose.

The Alberta Advisory Committee on Immunization (AACI) recommends that all patients aged 18 and over are offered a booster at the six-month interval, and that a strong clinical recommendation is issued for those aged 40 and over, as well as those with a chronic health condition that puts them at a greater risk of a severe health outcome. Long COVID clinic information

Clinic and referral information is now available for a new Calgary Zone Long COVID clinic that provides wraparound multi-disciplinary care for patients suffering from severe symptoms at least 12 weeks post-infection.

The Long COVID Inter-Professional Outpatient Program (IPOP), which is a hybrid virtual and in-person clinic, offers medical and rehabilitation services. In-person clinics are located at the Rockyview General Hospital and the Peter Lougheed Centre.

Clinic teams consisting of nurse practitioners and registered nurses develop care plans and consult with specialists. Once patients are stable, they are discharged back to their family physician. Patient eligibility is as follows:

- 18 years or older with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 diagnosis
- Post-COVID symptoms persisting for more than 12 weeks
- Requires complex medical management and/or rehabilitation based on <u>functional scale</u>

Patients with single system involvement (for example, cardiac, neurology), should use the usual referral processes to the appropriate specialty. Patients with ongoing respiratory symptoms only should be referred to the clinic for triage and will be transferred to the COVID lung clinics via Pulmonary Central Access and Triage (PCAT).

Referral forms should be sent to Long COVID Central Access with:

- Reason for referral
- Investigations to date
- Quadrant of city in which patient resides (if in Calgary) to enable triage to north or south locations

- Pediatric and adult otolaryngology: Also closed Monday, December 27 to Monday, January 3
