

COVID-19 guidance for community clinics

With further COVID-19 measures due to be lifted in Alberta next week, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA) has developed a guidance document to support community clinics.

The document references masking, personal protective equipment, point-of-care risk assessments and administrative controls. Indoor masking requirements and other measures are due to be removed on Tuesday, March 1 as part of Step 2 of <u>Alberta's reopening plan</u>.

The CPSA also put together an FAQ to address existing hot topics such as the two items below:

- Requiring patients to wear masks in clinics: "While you can request that children wear masks within a
 medical clinic, you cannot deny care if they refuse, or their guardian refuses on their behalf. For
 children who cannot or will not wear masks, clinics may offer virtual appointments, or dedicate a
 specific time of day and exam room for in-person assessments."
- Clinic protocols: "Clinic managers and employers can ask their staff to continue wearing masks and any
 other necessary PPE while working within the clinic. While physicians cannot deny care to a patient
 who refuses to wear a mask, you may use your judgment and experience to determine if the patient
 may be treated safely in another way."

When Alberta enters Step 2, the guidance document and FAQ will be updated to reference adults – in addition to children – no longer being required to wear masks indoors.

Alberta Health Services has updated its <u>guidance document</u> for community providers. There is also an updated <u>testing and screening document</u> for long-term care, designated supportive living and hospice settings.

Pediatric vaccines

Some community clinics will begin offering pediatric vaccines next week as part of a plan to increase options for families with children aged five to 11.

Starting Wednesday, March 2, clinics currently offering COVID-19 vaccinations that have expressed interest in vaccinating children will receive doses that can be offered to clinic patients. More information will be released shortly about how clinics not enrolled in the program can participate. <u>More information</u>.

In addition, selected AHS clinics will begin offering extended hours for pediatric vaccination, while pharmacies with extended hours and with experience vaccinating children will also be able to offer the vaccine. Pediatric vaccine biological information.
