

Stage 3 reopening guidance

The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA) has developed a <u>Stage 3 reopening guide</u> for community physicians and clinics.

The document details guidelines and recommendations for COVID-19-related topics including vaccination, point-of-care risk assessments and personal protective equipment. Recommendations include:

- Employers should facilitate opportunities for staff and volunteers to pursue vaccination against COVID-19 (such as providing time off).
- When patients present for COVID-19 symptom assessments, or patients cannot or will not wear a mask, clinics should offer virtual appointments or dedicate specific times and rooms for in-person assessments.
- Ensure hand sanitizer is available to patients throughout the facility.
- Continue to remove all communal items that cannot be easily cleaned.
- Minimize the need for patients to wait in the waiting room; attempt to facilitate physical distancing.
- It is strongly recommended that any physician or clinic personnel who are allowed an expedited return to Canada still use heightened caution if they return to work in the 14 days after their arrival.
- Clinics may continue to ask patients about their recent travel history during point-of-care risk assessments to assist in diagnosis and in strategizing treatment options.

The CPSA has also released an <u>FAQ</u> for community providers.

180 clinics join vaccination campaign

About 180 family doctors' offices in Alberta have now joined the community vaccination campaign, which offers patients the choice of being immunized by their trusted health-care provider.

A search tool has been added to the <u>Alberta Find a Doctor website</u> to allow patients to find out if their physician is part of the program. Users can search via the clinic directory or enter an address and <u>search using a map</u>.

The community vaccination initiative is a partnership between the Alberta Medical Association, Primary Care Networks and Alberta Health.
