

Notifications impacted as Connect Care comes to Calgary area

This weekend's Connect Care rollout at selected sites in the Calgary area may affect how some physicians and clinics receive admit and discharge notifications.

The Peter Lougheed Centre (PLC) and rural acute and long-term care and urgent care in Airdrie, Okotoks, Cochrane and at Sheldon M. Chumir Health Centre and South Calgary Health Centre are among the local sites scheduled to be involved in the Saturday, May 28 launch. See the <u>timeline</u> for more details.

The biggest change primary care providers will notice is that deceased notifications will cease immediately at all sites. Admission and discharge notifications for sites not connected to the Connect Care launch – including Foothills Medical Centre, Rockyview General Hospital and South Health Campus – will not be affected, and clinics will continue to receive notifications by fax.

Effective this weekend, admission and discharge notifications for PLC and rural acute will be received as follows:

- Providers or clinics on CII/CPAR are not impacted and will continue to receive eNotifications as usual
- Those on eDelivery will receive admission and discharge notifications through eDelivery
- Providers not on eDelivery will receive those notifications via fax, as usual

Evusheld added to COVID-19 treatment options

A new medication for the prevention of COVID-19 in patients who are highly immunocompromised is now being offered to Albertans.

Evusheld, a combination of two long-acting antibodies (tixagevimab and cilgavimab), binds to the SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19 to prevent it from entering cells in the body.

Provided through a third-party provider, it is not a replacement for vaccination. Eligible patients must wait 14 days after vaccination or COVID-19 infection recovery before taking the medication.

Patients who are immunocompromised and unlikely to mount an adequate immune response to vaccination – and have the highest demonstrated risk of severe outcomes – could potentially benefit from Evusheld. More resources are below:

Monkeypox information

Lab testing is available for monkeypox through the public health laboratory. For all cases of suspected monkeypox, physicians are advised to consult with the on-call virologist and the AHS Medical Officer of Health. Contact, droplet and airborne precautions should be taken, and patients suspected of having monkeypox should be provided with a surgical or procedure mask on arrival and placed in a separate room with the door closed.
