

# Panel on primary care with Health Minister Jason Copping

The PCN webinar scheduled for Monday, November 22 has been cancelled. In its place, a <u>webinar</u> aimed at family physicians across Alberta will be held by the Alberta Medical Association.

On Monday, November 22 from 6:30 – 8 p.m., all primary care physicians are invited to join physician leaders from the Sections of Family and Rural Medicine and the Primary Care Networks for a moderated panel conversation on primary care with Health Minister Jason Copping about his priorities for improving both Alberta's health system overall, as well as primary care.

# **PCN webinar: Pediatric vaccination**

Pediatric vaccination and the role primary care can play in addressing hesitancy will be the focus of the next webinar in the PCN COVID-19 and mental health series.

On Monday, December 13, from 6 – 8 p.m., Dr. Rick Ward and Dr. Christine Luelo will be joined by a panel of experts to discuss the rollout of vaccines for five- to 11-year-olds and the critical part family physicians can play.

# **Outpatient treatment for patients with COVID-19: sotrovimab**

On Tuesday, November 9, Alberta Health Services and Alberta Health rolled out the administration of <u>sotrovimab</u>, a new monoclonal antibody treatment for patients with COVID-19 that was recently approved by Health Canada.

Sotrovimab is a new drug that was developed to treat patients with mild to moderate symptoms of COVID-19. It is the first treatment to be offered to outpatients in Alberta and is administered by intravenous infusion within five days of symptom onset.

Importantly, Health Canada states that they have "authorized the sale of this COVID-19 drug based on limited clinical testing in humans and/or quality information."

In phase one of the AHS rollout, treatment will focus on COVID-19 patients who are either:

- Age 55\* or older and unvaccinated (defined as a patient who hasn't received any doses of a COVID-19 vaccine) (\* Initially, this was 65+, but has been updated.)
- Solid organ transplant patients or stem cell transplant patients, regardless of vaccination status.

<u>Patients</u> who have tested positive for COVID-19 and whose symptoms began less than four days ago can call 1-844-343-0971 to find out if they qualify to receive sotrovimab.

If physicians are contacted by patients with newly diagnosed COVID-19, and either patient or physician queries eligibility for this treatment, they should direct patients to call 1-844-343-0971 to determine eligibility and not make referrals directly — unless they are overseeing the care of a solid organ or stem cell transplant patient. <u>FAQs for Healthcare Providers</u>

Because of this new treatment, we have updated the adult pathway.

# Third dose, single-dose vaccines and vaccination record support

New information about third doses for health-care workers, a single-dose vaccine and support for vaccination record difficulties is now available.

Health-care workers who provide direct patient care and received a second dose less than eight weeks after the first are eligible for a third shot. Please refer to the Alberta COVID-19 immunization program update for the <u>full details and recommendations</u> for all eligible individuals.

Effective Friday, November 12, Albertans 18 years and older can book appointments to receive the Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) vaccine by calling 811. Due to limited supply, the Janssen vaccine will only be administered at AHS clinics in select locations across the province.

Additionally, as Alberta immunization records without a QR code are <u>no longer accepted</u> as proof of vaccination by the Restrictions Exemption Program, there is support available for people having trouble with their vaccination records:

# **Request for input: Vaccine Hesitancy Guide**
