# Lab booking tool for physicians

Physicians can now use an <u>online booking tool</u> to request time-sensitive lab appointments for patients who need to be seen quickly.

The service is designed for cases where a faster turnaround time for lab results – between seven and 21 days – is needed to facilitate treatment, diagnosis or ongoing monitoring of medications. Examples could include:

- Tests that will have a direct impact on a patient's need for specialist access
- Follow-up from an emergency room or hospital visit where lab work was requested but not booked
- Repeating abnormal lab work when a patient has experienced testing delays or not been able to access specialty follow-up
- Concerns about a possible cancer diagnosis or investigation of ongoing symptoms
- Chronic disease management that has been delayed due to COVID-19 and for which lab work is needed to determine ongoing care

### Influenza campaign kicks off

Alberta's influenza immunization campaign is underway, with community physicians receiving influenza and pneumococcal-23 vaccines from Accuristix via the Alberta Vaccine Inventory (AVI) system.

The process is very similar to the one used for ordering COVID-19 vaccine. Program registration information.

### **Continuing care restrictions**

New public health restrictions have been introduced at continuing care centres to help reduce the risk of residents getting COVID-19.

Effective Monday, October 25, masking will be required for all visitors, while residents will be required to quarantine after being admitted to the facility or returning from hospital until they test negative for COVID-19.

Unvaccinated friends and family members are strongly encouraged not to visit residents in person. Facility operators have the option of implementing additional rules, such as requiring proof of vaccination. <u>More details</u>.

### Long COVID posters, pathway updates

Posters explaining long COVID symptoms to patients are now available for download. Designed for waiting and exam rooms, they are available in <u>letter size</u> and  $\frac{11\times17}{2}$ .

With the development of the Calgary Zone's <u>long COVID pathway</u> for physicians and nurse practitioners, the <u>COVID-19 adult pathway</u> has been updated to include long COVID links and resources.

### Surgical tele-advice services resume

Six Specialist LINK surgical tele-advice services that have been temporarily unavailable in recent months are now back online, effective Monday, October 25.

With COVID-19 creating additional pressure on surgical staffing, some of the six surgical sub-specialty teleadvice lines were not available this fall and were consolidated into one general surgery line at the start of October. The following six services are now available again, Monday to Friday, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

- Colorectal surgery
- Endocrine surgery
- General surgery
- Hepatobiliary
- Surgical oncology
- Upper GI bariatrics
