

Third-dose eligibility, influenza

Eligibility for third doses of COVID-19 vaccine has opened up to include Albertans aged 75 and older and First Nations, Inuit and Métis people aged 65 and older. Appointments can be booked at least six months after the second dose was administered.

The list of those eligible for a third dose also includes the following:

- Residents of supportive living and congregate care facilities
- Immunocompromised Albertans
- Those travelling to a jurisdiction that does not accept visitors vaccinated with Covishield/AstraZeneca or mixed doses (mRNA vaccine)

Third-dose eligibility was expanded, effective Wednesday, October 6, following recommendations from the Alberta Advisory Committee on Immunization. <u>More details</u>.

Alberta's influenza campaign is due to get underway on Monday, October 18. The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) released <u>new recommendations</u> last month indicating that COVID-19 vaccines can now be co-administered with or given before or after other vaccines with no minimum spacing. Community clinic COVID-19 vaccination

The Alberta Vaccine Booking System, which allows patients to book COVID-19 vaccination <u>appointments</u> <u>online</u>, is expanding to include community physician offices.

The portal, which currently includes Alberta Health Services clinics and pharmacies, is being updated to incorporate the addition of community clinics. Timelines have not yet been confirmed. During the transition, clinics will continue to have the option of being listed as a vaccinating clinic on <u>Alberta Find a Doctor</u>, via that website's <u>search tool</u>, which directs patients to contact clinics directly to enquire about appointments.

School outbreaks, public health restrictions

Reporting of COVID-19 cases and outbreaks in schools has resumed, effective Wednesday, October 6. The change means there will be public reporting when schools have at least two COVID-19 cases, while outbreaks will be declared when 10 or more COVID-19 cases are reported within a 14-day period.

Effective Tuesday, October 12, parents will be informed if their child may have been exposed to a case that was infectious while at school. School authorities have also been asked to develop processes for contact notification. AHS is expected to take the lead on contact notification in schools in the coming weeks. Rapid testing will also be made available in kindergarten to Grade 6 schools.

Effective Wednesday, October 6, additional public health measures were introduced to set limits on gatherings, as follows:

- Vaccinated Albertans: Indoor private social gatherings are limited to two households, up to a maximum of 10 vaccine-eligible, vaccinated people. There are no restrictions on children under 12
- Unvaccinated Albertans: Indoor social gatherings are not permitted
- The restrictions do not apply to support groups or workers accessing homes to provide care, home repairs and maintenance
- Outdoor private social gatherings are limited to 20 people, with social distancing between households
