Measles update

Physicians are being warned about potential measles cases due to travel.

Although no cases have been confirmed in Alberta, AHS is advising those with symptoms to stay at home, avoid contact with others and call 811 before visiting health facilities. Symptoms are as follows:

- Fever of 38.3 C or higher
- Cough, runny nose, or red eyes, and
- A red, blotchy rash appearing three to seven days after fever starts, beginning behind the ears and on the face and spreading down to the body and then to the arms and legs

Stabilization funding

The Alberta Medical Association began distributing transitional funding support payments to eligible physicians on Thursday, April 4.

Only about half of the family and rural physicians who are eligible to receive funding of \$24,000 to \$40,000 have signed up for the program. To apply:

Mpox information

Physicians and teams are reminded to keep mpox (formerly known as monkeypox) on the differential diagnosis when seeing patients with relevant symptoms and risk factors.

Mpox is a rare pox-like disease and symptoms include a painful rash, lymphadenopathy, fatigue, fever, myalgias, and generalized malaise. The rash begins as a macule then progresses to a painful vesicle. Mpox should be considered in the diagnosis of someone who has had, within 21 days prior to the onset of symptoms, any of the following exposures:

- Sexual contact with new, anonymous or multiple partner(s)
- Sexual contact with a person(s) who had sexual contact with new, anonymous, or multiple partner(s)
- Significant contact with a person who had skin lesions such as macules, papules, pustules, vesicles or ulcers with no known alternate cause
- Contact with a known or probable case of mpox

Mental health changes

Alberta is creating two new organizations to support mental health and addiction.

<u>Recovery Alberta</u> will be responsible for the delivery of mental health and addiction services currently provided by AHS, while the <u>Canadian Centre of Recovery Excellence</u> will build recovery-oriented systems of care.

The new organizations will be part of the mental health and addiction organization created later this year as part of the Government of Alberta's refocusing health care plan. More details.
