

Fall webinar: Alcohol use disorder

A new alcohol use disorder pathway for primary care physicians and teams will be the focus of an October webinar as the Calgary Zone's series returns this fall.

On Monday, October 16, from 6–8 p.m., Dr. Monty Ghosh will join co-hosts Dr. Rick Ward and Dr. Christine Luelo to discuss the pharmacological management options highlighted in the pathway, which was developed by the Calgary Zone PCNs. The pathway is expected to be published in September.

Musculoskeletal injections, introduced by Dr. Arun Gupta, and the fall 2023 immunization plan are among the other topics that will be featured in the webinar, which is open to all physicians, nurse practitioners, clinic staff and teams.
