

Updated non-alcoholic fatty liver disease pathway

A new approach to risk stratifying non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD) patients in primary care is detailed in an update to one of the Calgary Zone's most <u>popular pathways</u>.

The <u>revised NAFLD pathway</u> is built around a "paradigm shift" in FIB-4 testing. The science behind the new approach will be explained in next week's <u>Calgary Zone webinar</u> – co-hosted by Dr. Rick Ward and Dr. Christine Luelo – which features several topics related to liver health. On Monday, February 26, from 6–8 p.m., Dr. Abdel Aziz Shaheen and Dr. Mark Swain will talk about FIB-4 testing, cirrhosis repatriation and alcohol use disorder liver scarring.

The <u>webinar</u> will also feature the usual primary care hot topics, and the Department of Family Medicine's Family Physician of the Year awards. Physicians attending the virtual webinar live will be eligible to apply for Mainpro+ credits. <u>Register</u>.

Panel management support program

More information has been provided about the panel management support program, which offers family physicians and rural generalists financial support to help manage the costs of caring for an increasing number of patients.

The funding was originally announced last fall, following the release of the final reports from the Modernizing Alberta's Primary Health Care System (MAPS) initiative. Eligible physicians should have received an email with a link to a declaration page on the Alberta Medical Association website. Those who are eligible and complete the declaration can expect to receive funding via direct deposit. Funding allocation is based on panel size.
