

Primary care reform underway

The future of primary care was in the spotlight earlier this week as the government announced new funding to support the implementation of interim recommendations released by the Modernizing Alberta's Primary Health Care System (MAPS) strategic and Indigenous advisory panels.

South Calgary Primary Care Network hosted <u>the announcement</u>, which included Health Minister Jason Copping pledging new investment in PCNs, physician payments and funding to strengthen and modernize primary health care. He accepted, in principle, all the recommendations from the MAPS panels, which relate to short-term opportunities to invest in primary care. Strategic panel recommendations included:

- · Stimulus funding for team-based care
- Expand the use of non-fee-for-service compensation models
- Integrated supports for vulnerable and underserved populations
- Enhanced access through virtual care
- Strengthen the role of patients and caregivers
- · Address the social determinants of health
- Reinstate the PCN operational stability fund policy

Recommendations from the <u>Indigenous panel</u> included the following:

- Create an Indigenous primary health care innovation fund
- Establish an Indigenous patient complaints investigator and Elders roster
- Appoint a panel to develop Indigenous cultural safety standards of care
- Create an Indigenous patient navigator program
- Support a mobile health clinic
- Create information sharing agreements

"These measures represent an important bridge to stabilize the primary health care system, support health care workers and ultimately provide better care to Albertans," said Dr. Janet Reynolds, co-chair of the strategic panel advisory group.

A final MAPS report, outlining a five- to 10-year vision for primary care, will be delivered in the spring. It will serve as the framework for the future delivery of primary care. <u>More information</u>.

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Lab ordering, swab changes

Effective Monday, February 27, DynaLIFE will complete the rollout of its online supply ordering portal.

Physician Leads Executive election

Dr. Heather La Borde has been elected to serve as the Calgary Zone's next PCN Physician Leads Executive.

Dr. La Borde, who has been on the board of Calgary Foothills PCN for the past seven years – including five as Board Chair – was the successful candidate following an election. A family physician at Bowmont Medical Clinic, Dr. La Borde sits on numerous zonal and provincial committees. Dr. La Borde will succeed Dr. Ernst Greyvenstein, who has held the position since October 2017. A six-month transition will begin in April 2023, with Dr. La Borde's three-year term officially starting on October 1, 2023.

There are five Physician Leads Executives in Alberta – one for each of the five PCN Zones. Their role is to gather local PCN issues and concerns on behalf of PCN physicians, provide support and a voice for local non-profit corporation issues, develop applicable strategies, and recognize and adhere to local autonomy.
