Transgender health tele-advice

Physicians and nurse practitioners in the Calgary area can now turn to Specialist Link for non-urgent transgender health advice.

Transgender health is the latest tele-advice service added to Specialist Link's growing roster of specialty advice services. It is available from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday (except statutory holidays). The service supports:

- Questions from physicians who need support for transgender and gender diverse patients
- Enquiries related to patients already on hormones who are seeking an opinion regarding transgender health
- Questions about monitoring, screening, defining lab targets, managing abnormal labs, side effects and other clinical concerns
- Resources or referral information for adult patients expressing gender diversity and wishing to start medical transition – for example, hormonal starts and gender-affirming surgery
- Appropriate resources and referral information for patients under the age of 18 expressing gender diversity, including exploration or starting medical transition

Specialist Link offers 52 tele-advice services, from addiction medicine to wound care. Requesting tele-advice is simple: Visit specialistlink.ca and click on the preferred service

Reminder: Vascular surgery referrals

A reminder that all vascular surgery referrals now go through Facilitated Access to Specialized Treatment (FAST). A new referral pathway explains the options available to providers:

- Non-urgent vascular surgery tele-advice is available via <u>specialistlink.ca</u>, from Monday to Friday, 8 a.m.–5 p.m.
- For non-urgent consultation, complete the <u>referral form</u>. Referrals are accepted via fax to 1-833-627-7023
- Urgent advice is available via RAAPID at 1-800-661-1700
- Emergencies should go to 911 or RAAPID, as appropriate

Pertussis information

Cases of pertussis, also known as whooping cough, have been identified in the Calgary area. The highly contagious respiratory infection is most infectious during the catarrhal stage (common cold symptoms) and the first two weeks after the onset of cough. If untreated, it can remain infectious for 21 days. More information.
