

Virtual mental health codes

Amendments to virtual mental health codes in the Schedule of Medical Benefits (SOMB) have come into effect, meaning physicians can start billing, retroactive to October 23, 2023. The changes, first announced in November 2023, mean the following:

- HSC 08.19CW will change from "per full 15 minutes" to "per 15 minutes or major portion thereof"
- New fee codes are in effect for virtual group therapy (HSCs 08.44AV, 08.44BV, 08.44CV, 08.44DV) and family therapy services (HSCs 08.45V, 08.45AV)
- A new fee code is in place for virtual psychiatric treatment (HSC 08.19GV) of complex patients
- New fee codes have been created for prolonged virtual consultations (HSCs 03.08IV, 03.08JV) and prolonged virtual repeat office visit or scheduled outpatient visit (HSC 03.03FT) for physician skill codes that are currently eligible for select prolonged services

The FIB-4 paradigm shift

General surgery set for central access launch

General surgery is the latest group to be added to the Facilitated Access to Specialized Treatment (FAST) program, with a launch planned for the Calgary area on Monday, February 26.

FAST is a central access and intake program that receives surgical referrals and sends them to a specific provider, clinic or site, to a next-available surgeon with the shortest wait time, or an out of Zone provider. Orthopaedics, urology and vascular surgery have already been added to FAST. A new general referral form will be available soon. <u>More information</u>.

Strep A resources

Physicians and teams are asked to be aware of the signs and symptoms of group A streptococcal (GAS) and invasive group A streptococcal (iGAS) infections following an increase in reported cases.

GAS can cause infections including pharyngitis, skin and soft tissue infections, and less commonly, scarlet fever, rheumatic fever, necrotizing fasciitis and toxic shock syndrome. Symptoms can include swelling, chills, muscle and joint aches, macular rash, bullae, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, malaise and pain of unusual severity. Antibiotic treatment is recommended for those with confirmed GAS pharyngitis.
