Reminder: ASaP screening maneuvers

The Alberta Screening and Prevention (ASaP) screening maneuvers menu has been updated to reflect changes to guidelines and policy. Changes include the following:

- The recommended test and interval for cervical cancer screening has changed for those aged 50-69 (Alberta Cervical Cancer Screening Program recommendations and policy)
- Evidence-based practice points have been updated to include current tools and advice

Reminder: HPV primary screening

Alberta has transitioned to HPV primary screening as the standard for cervical cancer screening beginning with women and people with a cervix aged 50 to 69.

Note: The Cervical Cancer Screening Clinical Practice Guidelines will be undergoing a review process over the next several months. Providers will be notified when updated guidelines are available.
