

# Spinal surgery tele-advice discontinued

The spinal surgery tele-advice hosted by Specialist Link has been discontinued.

Effective Monday, July 17, the service – launched in 2019 – was closed by the specialist group. The other surgical tele-advice services available via Specialist Link remain open. They are as follows:

- Colorectal surgery
- Endocrine surgery

Another option for physicians and nurse practitioners seeking non-urgent advice for spinal issues is to submit an <u>eReferral Advice Request</u>. Urgent spinal questions should be directed to RAAPID and 911, as appropriate. Physicians can also reference the Strategic Clinical Network's <u>low-back assessment clinical pathway</u>.

## Health mandate letter

The Government of Alberta has published its <u>health mandate letter</u>, which outlines Premier Danielle Smith's expectations for Minister of Health Adriana LaGrange. Highlights include:

• Supporting primary care as the foundation of our healthcare system by assessing alternative models of care and leveraging all health care professionals. This includes continuing the work of the Modernizing Alberta's Primary Healthcare System (MAPS) initiative ... and increasing the number of Albertans attached to a medical home.

- Developing a series of reforms to the healthcare system that enhance local decisionmaking authority, improve health care services for all Albertans, and create a more collaborative working environment for our health care workers by incentivizing regional innovation and increasing our ability to attract and retain the health care workers we need.
- Working to address rural health challenges such as access to health care professionals.

Due to a supply shortage of urea breath test collection kits (for helicobacter pylori), primary care providers are being asked to postpone requests. Existing appointments will be honoured, if possible. Normal service is expected to resume in August 2023.
