Alberta Surgical Initiative update

About 80 per cent of referrals sent through the Facilitated Access to Specialized Treatment (FAST) program are being sent to a surgeon's office for triage.

A <u>one-pager</u> on the program, which is part of the Alberta Surgical Initiative, revealed that two out of 10 referrals are being declined due to missing information. The first phase of FAST, a central access and intake program, includes orthopedics, spine and urology.
