

AHS lifts continuous masking requirements

Alberta Health Services is set to rescind its continuous masking requirements at all AHS facilities next week, including continuing care and contracted sites.

Effective Monday, June 19, the change in policy will apply to patients, families, and visitors at AHS facilities, as well as Alberta Precision Laboratories, Covenant Health and Carewest sites. It will also apply to AHS and contracted staff including physicians, midwives, students, volunteers and contractors. More information.
