A new measles resources document aimed at health-care providers is now available from AHS. It consolidates information from several sources and references symptoms, complications, prevention and control. [Read the document.](#)

With cases continuing to rise in Alberta, please review the latest information about exposure advisories, including a [case this week](#) at Calgary International Airport.

All practitioners in the Calgary Zone are advised to consider measles in under-vaccinated individuals presenting with a febrile illness. Locally acquired cases may not have a known source. Appointments for immunization are available within the week across the zone. A measles hotline was launched earlier this month at 1-844-944-3434. Physicians can also report suspected and probable cases to the physician reporting line at 1-844-343-0971 (option 1).

COVID-19 vaccination updates

This fall, Alberta will provide COVID-19 vaccinations free of charge to three high-risk groups, while there will be a cost to all other Albertans. Free-of-charge vaccinations will be offered to these three high-risk groups:

- Residents of seniors supportive living accommodations and home care clients.
- Individuals six months of age and older with underlying medical conditions or compromised immune systems or in congregate living accommodations.
- Albertans on social programs (i.e., AISH, income supports, those experiencing homelessness).

The vaccination program is set to roll out in the fall in four phases. Starting Monday, August 11, eligible Albertans can signal their intent to receive the COVID-19 and influenza vaccines by pre-ordering through the Alberta Vaccine Booking System.

The Alberta government is recommending that Albertans talk to their primary care provider to determine the best course of action for their vaccination needs.

Ordering changes for CBC and differential

Changes have been made for ordering CBC and differentials within a 24-hour period. If a clinic has already ordered a single CBC and differential for a patient and decides to repeat the order within 24 hours, the differential will not be completed again within the 24-hour timeframe. Routine C. diphtheriae toxin testing

AHS has discontinued routine toxin testing for *Corynebacterium diphtheriae* in cutaneous (skin) specimens. Providers involved in wound care should be aware that toxin testing will now require prior consultation with a microbiologist or infectious disease specialist. [Read the bulletin](#).

Reminder: Delayed results for Parvovirus IgM testing

Effective immediately, Parvovirus B19 IgM antibody testing will temporarily shift from daily to biweekly processing due to resource and supply constraints. [Read the lab bulletin](#).

Reminder: Insulin antibody testing process

Effective immediately, Insulin Antibody testing relevant for suspected autoimmune diabetes (especially Type 1) or insulin allergy workups is being centralized to improve test consistency and turnaround times. Please review the new process. [Read the lab bulletin](#).
