Lab changes

A new provincial requisition form has been introduced for all community microbiology testing.

The form can be <u>downloaded here</u>; it should also be available in most EMRs. It was updated and posted by Alberta Precision Laboratories (APL) earlier this week. <u>Read the bulletin</u>.

New lab portal launches next month: APL's new community lab supply ordering portal is set to be launched on Monday, April 1. To prepare for the launch, all community providers must verify their account by emailing <u>CPSMOperaations.EOC@albertahealthservices.ca</u>. Failure to do so will result in the inability to access or order clinical lab test supplies. <u>More information</u>.

Molecular vaginitis screen: Effective Monday, March 11, microscopy for bacterial vaginosis/yeast will be replaced with a molecular vaginitis screen that combines tests for bacterial vaginosis, vaginal candidiasis and trichomoniasis. The new screen requires only one swab. <u>Read the bulletin</u>.
