

## More doctors, NPs taking patients

The availability of primary care providers hit a four-year high in Alberta this week, with 508 family doctors and nurse practitioners (NPs) listed as taking patients on the Alberta Find a Doctor website and the Calgary area showing the biggest growth.

After several years of declining numbers of physicians accepting new patients, 2024-25 statistics show a marked increase in all five health zones, with the Calgary area going from 47 physicians and NPs taking patients in March 2024 to 251 a year later – an increase of over 400 per cent. As of Thursday, May 15, that number had further increased to 284, with 15 listed as accepting patients in the south zone, 45 in central, 99 in Edmonton and 65 in the north.

Alberta Find a Doctor, a free online service available at <u>albertafindadoctor.ca</u>, was launched in 2019 to make it quicker and easier for Albertans to find a family physician, NP or clinic. It is a partnership between Primary Care Networks and Alberta Health. Boosted by an increase in the number of family doctors and NPs listed on the website and taking patients, the website attracted more than 1.2 million visits between April 2024 and March 2025. Dr. Spady and Dr. Nadia Salvaterra, from the Edmonton Zone, have been appointed as ACMOs and will work alongside former Calgary Zone PCN Physician Lead Dr. Ernst Greyvenstein, Primary Care Alberta's Chief Medical Officer.

## Measles poster, hotline

A measles poster is now available for clinics and providers who want to remind patients how to check their immunization records. Download it here.

A measles hotline was also launched earlier this month as the number of cases in Alberta continues to rise. The Health Link service, available at 1-844-944-3434, supports patients to find their health records, book immunization appointments and get health advice if they are experiencing symptoms or feeling unwell. As of Thursday, May 15, there were just over 400 confirmed measles cases in Alberta, including 269 in south Zone and 11 in the Calgary area.

A reminder that clinics and providers are asked to flag all suspected, probable and confirmed cases of measles by calling 1-844-343-0971. ## Reminder: Hematology advice

Additional resources are available for physicians seeking hematology advice, which is the most in-demand telephone advice service offered through Specialist Link.

The tele-advice line received more than 2,000 calls in 2024-25, over 200 more than the next most popular service and about 10 per cent of the total call volume for Specialist Link. To help manage call volume, providers are reminded that there is a separate tele-advice service for any enquiries related to thrombosis.
