

Specialist Link: By the numbers

More than 22,000 tele-advice calls were logged in 2024-25 as Specialist Link continued to provide access to real-time advice from specialists and specialty groups.

The annual *By the numbers* report, which can be <u>downloaded here</u>, revealed that hematology, endocrinology and obstetrics & gynecology were the three most requested telephone advice services of the 52 available via <u>specialistlink.ca</u>.

There were also more than 34,000 pathway downloads last year, with NAFLD, migraine and irritable bowel syndrome leading the way.

Specialist Link, which provides tele-advice, pathways and other resources to family physicians and nurse practitioners, has logged more than 143,000 calls since 2014.

Measles exposure risk in South Zone

A standing measles exposure advisory has been issued for South Zone due to the large number of cases reported in the south of the province.

All individuals living, working or attending school in, or travelling to, the South Zone are advised to be aware of the significant current risk for measles disease and ensure immunizations are up to date. A total of 491 cases had been reported as of Thursday, May 29, compared to 12 in the Calgary Zone.

All practitioners in the Calgary Zone, but especially those working in communities near the South Zone, are advised to consider measles in under-vaccinated individuals presenting with a febrile illness. Locally acquired cases may not have a known source. Please read the memo from the Calgary Zone Medical Officers of Health.

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Appointments for immunization are available within the week across the zone. A measles hotline was also launched earlier this month at 1-844-944-3434. Physicians can also report suspected and probable cases to the physician reporting line at 1-844-343-0971 (option 1).

Indigenous support line

Effective Tuesday, June 2, a support line for Indigenous patients and families will be expanded to Calgary and Edmonton.

Operated by Health Link in partnership with the Indigenous Wellness Core, the line connects callers with health professionals who understand Indigenous ways of knowing and traditional healing practices.

It can also be utilized by front-line healthcare providers to assist in providing culturally appropriate care. Providers can use the support line to learn about cultural support services, Indigenous ways of knowing, traditional healing practices, access to ceremony and other services that may assist their patients. The service is available at 1-844-944-4744 or 811. It is currently available only in North, Central and South Zones.
