

Primary care access, MAPS final report

The future of primary care in Alberta was in the spotlight this week as the Government of Alberta announced a series of measures to <u>improve access</u> and also released the final reports of the <u>Modernizing Alberta's Primary Health Care System</u> (MAPS) initiative. Highlights included:

- A \$57-million fund, over three years, to provide family doctors and nurse practitioners with support to help manage growing panels. Each provider could receive up to \$10,000 a year. Specifics about how to apply for the funding are yet to be announced.
- A task force will be established to recommend a new payment model for family physicians.
- A memorandum of understanding will be developed with the Alberta Medical Association to transition to a new physician compensation model, modernize primary care governance and stabilize primary care.
- Doctors will be able to bill for virtual mental health checks and therapy, and there will be compensation for extra time spent with patients virtually.
- A payment system will be introduced to support nurse practitioners to work in communities in independent practice to manage a panel of patients.
- The <u>strategic advisory panel final report</u> (MAPS) was also released. It includes 11 recommendations based on access to team-based care, integration and a coordinated and accountable primary health care system. It will act as a "road map" for reform.
- An Indigenous health division will be created, and \$20 million allocated for Indigenous communities to design and deliver primary care. The <u>Indigenous advisory panel final</u> report includes 22 recommendations.

The strategic advisory panel report includes a series of recommendations that relate to the future of PCNs, including expanding the PCN model to establish regional primary health care networks. More information will be shared as it becomes available.
