

Connect Care to launch at Calgary sites

The next phase of the Connect Care launch is coming to the Calgary area next month, with Foothills Medical Centre, Richmond Road Diagnostic and Treatment Centre and pharmacy and diagnostic sites among the facilities due to be added.

Starting Sunday, November 6 – the scheduled launch date – community family physicians will begin receiving clinical documentation from Connect Care via their EMR, email and fax. More information.

Key changes to note are as follows:

- Connect Care identifiers should be used on all requisitions
- Confirm your identifier here (provideridlookup.ahs.ca)
- Update provider and clinic information, as appropriate
- Results from ECGs and some diagnostic imaging may continue to be sent via mail or fax only
- A reminder that Connect Care uses a single default provider location. Physicians can
 designate their default clinic by emailing servicedesk.emrbis@ahs.ca
- If the list of physicians working at your clinic needs to be updated, submit a request to add or remove a provider location.

Please note that Rockyview General Hospital and South Health Campus are scheduled to be part of a subsequent Connect Care launch, which is currently scheduled for the spring of 2023.

Influenza campaign kicks off

Alberta's influenza immunization campaign is underway, with shots available to all Albertans aged six months and older.

For this year's campaign, quadrivalent inactivated influenza – Fluzone or FluLaval Tetra – is the provincially funded vaccine. It will be offered to those under the age of 65. A high-dose quadrivalent inactivated vaccine will be available to those aged 65 and older.

If your clinic is not offering flu shots, patients can <u>book an appointment online</u> or by calling 811. Some pharmacies are offering walk-in appointments for patients aged five and over. AHS public health clinics are offering appointments to children under five, their parents and household members, as well as those without a provincial health care number.

As of Saturday, October 1, 14 lab-confirmed cases of seasonal influenza had been reported in the Calgary Zone. <u>Latest statistics</u>.

Note: Influenza vaccines and bivalent COVID-19 boosters can be given at the same time, in most cases.

The recommended age for biennial (every two years) breast cancer screening for average risk women has been lowered to 45 from 50. Guidelines have been updated by the Alberta Breast Cancer Screening Clinical Practice Guideline Committee.

PCN Physician Lead opportunity

Nominations are now being accepted for the role of Calgary Zone PCN Physician Lead.

A critical leadership role in primary care in the Calgary Zone and provincially, nominations are being accepted for a family physician to serve a three-year term that starts October 1, 2023. The term is renewable by election.

Incumbent Dr. Ernst Greyvenstein, who has made a huge impact since taking on the role in 2017, is due to end his term in September 2023. <u>Watch a video of Dr. Greyvenstein</u> describing the role.

There is one Physician Lead Executive (PLE) in each of the five health Zones in Alberta. Read the <u>role description</u>. The PLE is responsible for advocating for fellow PCN physicians within the Zone and province-wide as well as helping to guide strategy or policy to advance the Patient's Medical Home. It is renumerated at a 0.3 FTE at the clinical ARP rate.

Reminder: Ortho, spine, urology referrals

A new process to centralize urology referrals, as well as non-urgent orthopaedics and spine referrals, is now in place in the Calgary Zone.

Referrals (other than oncology or paediatric orthopaedics) should be sent to **1-833-627-7023**. There are no changes to referral forms and a 12-week grace period is in place, meaning that if referrals are sent directly to the surgeon, specialist or the old central access number, a note will be faxed back indicating it has been forwarded for review.

<u>Urology</u> and <u>orthopaedics & spine</u> access pathways posted on <u>specialistlink.ca</u> have been updated to reflect the change.
