Hepatitis B exposure risk

About 1,500 patients who received care via the Calgary Midwives Collective are being notified of a potential hepatitis B risk due to improperly sterilized medical equipment.

Although the risk is considered very low, Alberta Health Services is advising patients who received prenatal, delivery and/or post-natal care to call their doctor and arrange for testing. For information about sequential testing, please read the memo.

Bivalent boosters available next week

Effective Wednesday, September 21, Albertans aged 18 and over will have the option of receiving a COVID-19 bivalent booster dose.

Those who have completed a primary series of COVID-19 vaccine (which includes a mix of AstraZeneca, Pfizer and Moderna) are eligible. The recommended interval is a minimum of five months from the last dose or previous infection.

Effective Monday, October 3, the bivalent booster will be offered to residents of congregate care facilities, along with the influenza vaccine.

The bivalent vaccine triggers a stronger immune response and provides additional protection against Omicron and the original SARS-CoV-2 strain. <u>More information</u>.
