

Stroke prevention clinic referral guidelines

Detailed <u>referral guidelines</u> are now available for Calgary's stroke prevention clinics.

Adults who have had a transient ischemic attack or a minor stroke can be referred to the clinics at Foothills Medical Centre and South Health Campus via central access at 403-944-1447 or via fax at 403-476-9635. The <u>updated guidelines</u> are also linked on the Specialist Link <u>neurology</u> access pathway.

Please note that episodes of pre-syncope, loss of consciousness & memory loss, and recurrent episodes of dizziness are unlikely to be transient ischemic attacks. Consider referring these patients to the emergency department, Urgent Neurology Clinic (phone 403-944-2372) or General Neurology Clinic as appropriate. Retinal vein occlusion and anterior ischemic optic neuropathy may be appropriate for ophthalmology referral.

The central access referral service provides a single point of entry for adults who require early assessment, treatment, and education. The guidelines provide detailed criteria for both urgent and routine referrals, as well as information about conditions not appropriate for referral.

Digital health card

The Government of Alberta has unveiled a new Mobile Health Card that can serve as valid proof of health insurance coverage and be presented at hospitals, clinics and other medical settings.

It is available to eligible Albertans aged 14 and older. Parents and guardians will be able to add their children's Mobile Health Cards to their own Alberta Wallets. Spouses and interdependent partners can also add each other's Mobile Health Cards to their Alberta Wallets.

Requisition printing: Effective Wednesday, October 1, automatic printing of Connect Care laboratory requisitions for blood and urine specimen orders will be disabled to improve workflows and reduce paper use. Patients are no longer required to have a printed form when visiting an Alberta Precision Laboratories site for blood or urine collection. More information.
