



## New referral process for orthopedics, urology, spine

A new process will be introduced in the Calgary Zone next month for all non-urgent urology, spine and orthopaedics referrals.

Effective Tuesday, October 11, physicians and clinic staff should send all referrals to a new, central fax number: 1-833-627-7023. Please note the following:

- There's no change to referral forms or letters at this time; new forms are due to be introduced later in the fall and included in Electronic Medical Records
- Specify if you want the next available provider with the shortest wait list, or a specific provider, clinic or site
- Please state if you are requesting an out-of-Zone referral and include the name of a preferred provider or clinic
- A reminder that tele-advice and access pathways are available via specialistlink.ca

Please note: There is a 12-week grace period for this change. If referrals are sent directly to the surgeon, specialist or the old central access number after October 11, a note will be faxed back indicating it has been forwarded for review.

The new process was developed as part of the Alberta Facilitated Access to Specialized Treatment (FAST) program, which is part of the Alberta Surgical Initiative (ASI). Urology, spine and orthopaedics are the first specialties to be added to the new central access and intake program; others will follow in the coming months.

### Surgery waitlist calls

Patients waiting for surgery in the Calgary Zone are being contacted by Alberta Health Services (AHS) as part of a new validation and confirmation project.

Throughout September, patients may receive a call or voicemail via an automated system. They will be asked for their personal health number and date of birth to confirm their identity. They will not be asked for financial information, and their place on the list will not be affected if they miss the call or hang up. <u>More details</u>.

### **Reminder: Hepatitis B exposure risk**

About 1,500 patients who received care via the Calgary Midwives Collective are being notified of a potential hepatitis B risk due to improperly sterilized medical equipment.

Although the risk is considered very low, Alberta Health Services is advising patients who received prenatal, delivery and/or post-natal care to call their doctor and arrange for testing. For information about sequential testing, please <u>read the memo</u>.

### **Bivalent booster information**

Albertans aged 18 and over now have the option of receiving a COVID-19 bivalent booster dose.

Those who have completed a primary series of COVID-19 vaccines (which includes a mix of AstraZeneca, Pfizer and Moderna) are eligible. The recommended interval is a minimum of five months from the last dose or previous infection. <u>More information</u>.
