

- Remember when people were worried about having enough PPE? Large-scale medical mask production in Calgary is now online
- Acute care capacity back to 'normal', but in Wave 1 we had plans to 4x capacity (thanks MEOC)
- Multiple vaccines in Phase 3 trials; Phase 1/2 trials demonstrate high B/T-cell immunogenicity
- ~640 excess deaths in Alberta between Feb-May; but only 146 COVID-19 deaths – all-in-all, we did quite well in Alberta

- Cases should isolate for 10 days or when symptoms end, whichever is longer
 - This is from the fact that live virus has not been found 8 days after Sx onset
 - Clearance swabs are almost never required
 - Once a case has cleared, effectively consider immune (can't get COVID-19, can't give COVID-19)
- Contacts should isolate for 14 days from when they last interacted with an infectious case
 - 14 days comes from the incubation period testing negative during the incubation period DOES NOT negate the isolation period
 - If you live with a case, if you can isolate from that case (i.e., not see them) your isolation period starts when you last saw the case; otherwise it's until they stop being infectious (so 10+14 days)
 - For those with children, a COVID+ teenager may be able to isolate from parents, a COVID+ infant not so much (but perhaps could only see one rather than both parents)

COVID-19 101 – TESTING



PCR Testing

- Generally quite sensitive if patient is symptomatic and within the first ~5 days of symptoms; after this it begins to taper off
- Note: Does not assess for 'live' virus (which is what makes someone infectious) options for live virus testing are very limited
- Limited rapid testing is available, generally not in the community

Serology Testing

- APL uses Abbott assay quite sensitive after ~3 weeks and also specific
- Currently requires MOH or Lab approval; limited clinical application so almost never going to be used in community

COVID-19 101 – LOGISTICS



- Testing turnaround time and access 811 or online tool to book
 - Attend swabbing centre (now minimal delays in Calgary since drivethrough Stampede ground opened)
 - Lab processes sample clerical (some delays as they look to hire more clerks)
 - Lab runs sample (minimal delay)
 - Result gets reported (some delays tell everyone to get <u>https://myhealth.alberta.ca/myhealthrecords</u>)
 - Negative tests
- Isolation hotels: If a case is unable to isolate from household contacts and wants an
 isolation hotel, email MOHCOVIDYYC@ahs.ca (this is monitored by public health residents)
- Other isolation supports: If people need support to isolate (e.g., financial support, food, transportation, etc.) please let your friendly PCN know

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Contact tracing app(s) – now we have ABTraceTogether and federal 'COVID Alert' which only works in Ontario but I hope will expand across Canada; in discussions to work together, lots of politics involved



Primary Care COVID Pathway improvement – recently awarded ~\$400K to improve the COVID pathways, so if people have any suggestions, please contact us (Rick, me)



'Behaviour Change (the last vestige of the desperate) Study' — Obtain deep behavioural insights to change COVID-19 behaviours (e.g., stay home when stick, download app, get vaccine, mask, avoid bars, etc.) and launch large-scale marketing campaign from top-tier agencies (think Coca-Cola, Juul, De Beers, etc.) since normal gov't PSAs can be bland and ineffective
